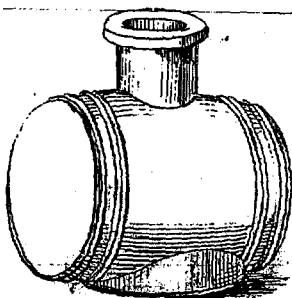

DESIGN FOR AN INK-BOTTLE.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

I, ALONZO FRENCH, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for an Inkstand, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of a barrel-shaped bottle, with the under portion of the barrel, opposite to the bung or neck, cut off, as shown at Figure 2, and projections extending out at the side from the center portion of the barrel, as shown at fig. 1, to make a firm bottom for it to rest upon, and keep it from rolling over.

I claim as my invention and design—

An improvement in the barrel-shaped bottle patented by I. N. Peirce October 17, 1865, (now owned by myself, "Liber 2, page 406, July 22, 1869,") consisting in making the under surface flat opposite the bung or neck, with projections extending out at the sides from the center portion of the barrel, substantially as shown and set forth.
